COMPETENCES	Enhancing interpersonal and expressional skills
DESCRIPTION	<p>Drama club deals with teaching creativity. The process itself is very important, not the result. All work goes through game and playing different roles. Improvisation is used to involve students into deeper communication. Different forms are used: personal improvisation, group improvisation. At the beginning more physical movements are used, later calmer. All roles and exercises are connected with real life – situations in the shop, at work and also conflict situations. Firstly, students play the situations and then discussion, how to find solutions to the problems, follows. Students show their feelings and mood with mime, walk and gestures. Also, speech is very important.</p>
LENGTH/HOURS	60 minutes
NUMBER OF SESSIONS	4 times a week
EVALUATION	Students can freely express themselves. There is no tension between players. One can feel important. Very

often students with bad behaviour are not praised during lessons but here they are praised. It helps to develop individual and critical thinking, helps better understand others.
